Telehealth Can Improve Student Trajectory



Every school leader wants students to feel and do their best.

The use of telehealth technology is valuable to school districts, especially as they develop remote learning solutions and prepare to welcome their students back to school safely.



What is Telehealth?

Telehealth is the union of technology and health care.

It uses a variety of technology and electronic communications to provide any health-related service remotely. Telehealth at school can help expand valuable services available in the school health office.

Fast Fact: Each school telehealth visit that addresses a student's need at the moment, returns an average of **3 hours** of learning time.







Benefit 1:

Telehealth decreases student absences



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Research shows that when schools provide healthcare services for their students, it has a measurable impact on reducing chronic absenteeism. By providing telehealth services at school, districts can:

- Help students manage health conditions that put them at risk for missing school due to symptoms
- Treat common health conditions during the school day
- Increase presence in the classroom, which leads to improved academic, and lifelong outcomes

Fast Facts:

Asthma is a leading cause of school absenteeism, accounting for about **14 million absences** each school year, and students with asthma are more than three times more likely to have ten or more absences than their peers.

Students miss nearly **2 million days of school** due to dental health problems and are **three times more likely** to miss school than their peers without dental pain.







Benefit 2:

Telehealth provides students more affordable healthcare



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Telehealth provides students more affordable healthcare

The simple act of taking a sick child to see a doctor can be complicated and expensive for many Americans. Families often incur transportation costs, additional childcare costs, co-pays, and potentially lost wages to take children to healthcare appointments.

Fast Fact:

For individuals paid hourly, an average of **3+ working hours** are lost each day caring for a sick child.











Benefit 3:

School telehealth services can improve healthcare access for students



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Recently, school districts have started to take advantage of telehealth solutions to improve broader healthcare access and support their students' academic success. **This approach has been critical because:**

- Children living in rural or otherwise medically underserved communities often have limited access to nearby healthcare providers
- During school closures, some students are vulnerable to completely losing access to health providers
- Studies have shown that school-based health centers
 utilizing telehealth were more likely to reach students in rural
 communities than school-based health centers that do not



Fast Fact:

An estimated 13 million young people living in rural, medically underserved areas.





Benefit 4:

School telehealth positively impacts students' immediate and long-term health

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School telehealth positively impacts students' immediate and long-term health

Many students from socioeconomically disadvantaged families experience constraints that hinder access to regular preventive healthcare.

Increased access to routine care via telehealth services can:

- Help students better implement healthy behaviors in all areas of their lives
- Provide management for chronic conditions (such as asthma or obesity)
- Help school districts close both health and academic achievement gaps for children



Fast Fact:

There is an inextricable link between health and academic achievement. Students in poorer health struggle more academically. Students who struggle at school are also **more likely to develop health conditions** as adults.





Benefit 5:

Telehealth expands valuable school health services

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Telehealth expands valuable school health services

For decades, in-school health services have helped promote equal access to basic healthcare. Telehealth can expand these critical services by supporting school nurses in real-time and partnering with school health services to provide immediate care. **Telehealth can help schools:**

- Address immediate medical needs, such as a child experiencing a high fever
- Manage chronic conditions like asthma, diabetes, or behavioral health concerns
- Provide convenient, fast access, so patients are more likely to keep up with a treatment plan

Fast Fact:

With telehealth, medical professionals can provide quick and efficient care for 90% of emergency and non-emergency needs.


Telehealth in schools can improve longterm academic outcomes for students

- Keep students focused in the classroom and improve academic outcomes

- Increase student instructional time and improve achievement rates

Lost instructional time **increases the likelihood** that students will drop out of high school and have large achievement gaps.

- Develop the appropriate policies, procedures, and protocols for managing contagious illnesses, including COVID-19, the flu, or the common cold

The use of school-based health centers is associated with improved delivery of vaccinations, comprehensive health assessments, oral health, vision, substance use, nutrition, and more.
