As educators, we should provide as many year-round learning experiences as possible that reflect our students' intersecting identities along with the lessons that offer insights into others with whom they may not have a deep understanding or appreciation. The value of offering these *mirrors and windows* is well established and should be provided thoughtfully and consistently in our nation's classrooms.

Jewish American Heritage Month began as Jewish Heritage Week in 1980 after being authorized by Congress and President Jimmy Carter proclaiming it for the week of April 21-28. In his proclamation, President Carter spoke of the "bountiful contributions made by the Jewish people to the culture and history of the United States." Between 1981 and 1990, Congress annually passed laws proclaiming a week in April or May as Jewish Heritage Week; the designations expanded to two week-long observances, with one in April and one in May through 2006. In February 2006, Congress urged the president to observe American Jewish History Month; on April 20, 2006, President George W. Bush issued the first proclamation designating May 2006 as Jewish American Heritage Month. This annual observance has continued to this day. Please note that there are a many resources in this guide that would be appropriate for recognizing Holocaust Remembrance Day, observed annually in either April or May.

While the custom of cultural monthly observances may seem out-of-date, please consider them as additional opportunities to highlight the achievements and contributions of a particular group of our citizenry in greater depth — a worthy goal. At a time when there is a critical need to promote acceptance, respect and harmony throughout our diverse communities, please consider engaging students in experiences that lead to a greater appreciation of the collective contributions made by others of similar, as well as differing, identities. Please also remember to provide adequate context to these accomplishments in light of the challenges our marginalized citizenry had to overcome to reach their goals. Hopefully, these learning experiences help students understand we are all woven into the rich cultural tapestry of humanity in this place we call America.
